UNDERWAY (0-2 YEARS)

GREENHOUSE

The addition of a new student research greenhouse located adjacent to the existing facilities will expand the research study area available for fruit experimentation.

FRUIT PROCESSING/EDUCATION BUILDING

The Fruit Processing Education Building will house an industry workforce training facility, analytical service laboratory and the Mountain Grove C-Flora. The facility is currently being prepared for these purposes.

PROGRAMMED (3-5 YEARS)

SHEPARD HALL RENOVATION

Renovation of the campus administrative building will provide additional laboratories and offices due to the relocation of the Paul Evans Library to Evans Hall.

STUDENT RESIDENCE HALL

The addition of an apartment style campus dormitory with the capacity of 100-200 people will provide housing for non-commuting students and visiting research personnel.

HORTICULTURE DEMONSTRATION AREA

The demonstration area east of Highway 99 displays fruit and other horticultural crops with a proposed parking for workforce and educational programs.

DEARK ARBORETUM

The Deark Arboretum established for the display and study of trees and plants serves plant science students and the public. The proposed ballfield walking trail will open the area to public access.

SHADEHOUSES

The addition of two shadehouses located adjacent to the existing facilities will expand the research study area available for fruit experimentation.

PROPOSED (6-10 YEARS)

MAINTENANCE BUILDING

The proposed facility of 5,000 square feet will provide dedicated storage space for existing and future F&M research equipment and expanded shop area.

FRUIT SALES BUILDING

The proposed facility will include a storefront sales area with adjoining cooler and apple grading area. It will serve as an example of a sales and storage area suitable for small direct market producers. The building will be used for the sale of extra fruit from the research and demonstration plantings, and will be licensed as the seasonal-dormitory school store.

PARKING AND CIRCULATION

A proposed parking lot south of Shepard Hall and east of the Classroom Building will provide spaces for shared use of the facilities. The proposed Vehicle Storage Building will be relocated to the east side of the campus creating a central service area while accommodating the parking lot. A second proposed parking lot east of Highway 99 will provide parking for staff and the public visiting the Horticulture Demonstration Area and proposed Fruit Sales Building. The proposed elevated road will replace the currently one-way road and create two-way access throughout the campus. The proposed addition of sidewalks will further enhance circulation and safety on campus.
