



### UNDERWAY (0-2 YEARS)

#### GREENHOUSE

The additional greenhouse will expand the virus indexing program to fruit crops other than grapes.

#### FRUIT PROCESSING EDUCATION BUILDING

The Fruit Processing Education Building will house an industry workforce training facility, analytical services laboratory and the Mountain Grove Cellars. The facility is currently being equipped for these purposes.

#### MSU CENTENNIAL GARDEN

A strategic flower border is being developed to the south and west of historic Found Hall to celebrate and commemorate the MSU Centennial.

#### LAND ACQUISITION

A 2.2 acre parcel of land directly east of the campus is being purchased. The dimensions of the parcel are 150 feet at the north and south boundaries and 345 feet at the east and west boundaries.

### PROGRAMMED (3-5 YEARS)

#### SHEPARD HALL RENOVATION

Renovation of the campus administration building will provide additional laboratories and offices due to the relocation of the Paul Evans Library to Faust Hall.

#### STUDENT RESIDENCE HALL

The addition of an apartment style campus identity will be the capacity of 10-20 people will provide housing for non-consuming students and visiting research personnel.

#### HORTICULTURE DEMONSTRATION AREA

The demonstration area west of Highway 50 displays fruit and other horticultural crops with a proposed garden for workshops and educational programs.

#### OSAKI ARBORETUM

The Osaki Arboretum established for the display and study of trees and plants serves plant science students and the public. The proposed turf site ecological trail will open the area to public access.

#### SHADEHOUSES

The addition of two shadehouses located adjacent to the existing facilities will expand the research/teaching area available for fruit experimentation.

#### VITICULTURE RESEARCH AND EDUCATION BUILDING

The new facility will afford administrative, research and service facilities.

### PROPOSED (6-10 YEARS)

#### MAINTENANCE BUILDING

The proposed facility of 5,184 square feet will provide sheltered storage space for existing and future test research equipment and expanded shop area.

#### FRUIT SALES BUILDING

The proposed facility will include a storefront sales area with adjoining cooler and apple grading area. It will serve as an example of a sales and storage area suitable for small direct market producers. The building will be used for the sale of early fruit from the research and demonstration plantings, and will be featured on the annual elementary school tour.

#### PARKING AND CIRCULATION

Improvements to the parking lot south of Shepard Hall and east of the Classroom Building will provide paved parking for shared use of the facilities. The present Vehicle Storage Building will be relocated to the southeast part of the campus with an addition for general maintenance use. A second proposed lot will afford 80 parking spaces for students and the public. A first proposed parking lot west of Highway 50 will provide parking for staff and the public visiting the Horticulture Demonstration Area and proposed Fruit Sales Building. The proposed relocated road will replace the primary one-way road and create two-way access throughout the campus. The proposed addition of sidewalks will further enhance circulation and safety on campus.
